Greeting

The Wedding Minister/Officiant faces the guests. The Bride and her Attendants stand to the right of the Officiant. The Groom and his Attendants stand to the left of the Officiant. The Bride and Groom stand facing the Officiant/Minister.

Officiant:

We are honored and grateful to be present here today to witness the sacred vows of marriage between _____ and _____, who were brought together by love's divine appointment and we rejoice with them in this moment of mystical matrimony.

Invocation

Officiant:

Let us now pause to establish ourselves in the consciousness of the holy presence and express our gratefulness for the blessed energy of divine love.

Gracious God, Divine Creator of all this wonder, we pray your light of love and joy shine down upon us as we gather today for the union of these two, _____ and _____. We thank you for love and for marriage, Dear Lord. Amen.

Presentation of the Bride (or the Bride and Groom)

Officiant: Who presents this woman to be married to this man?

Or, Officiant: Who presents these individuals to be married?

The parent(s) or designated person(s) responds: I do or We do.

If the Bride has not already handed her bouquet to her Maid/Matron of honor, she will do so now, and her father gives her hand to the groom, he usually kisses his daughter and shakes the Grooms hand then he takes his seat. This Presentation of the Bride is optional and can be adapted to the situation or can be left out completely.

Charge to Bride and Groom

Officiant: _____ and _____, the estate of wedlock is a holy one, one not to be entered into lightly, but only under the guidance of Infinite Wisdom and the inspiration of Divine Love.

Dear Ones, you are entering into the relationship of marriage which is an expression of the harmonizing power of divine love. When there is a true bond such as this, it is proper that public acknowledgement of it be made. We are here to bear witness to your entering into this closer relationship of husband and wife as you pledge your vows to one another.

Betrothal

Officiant: As an expression of your total willingness to commit yourself to one another, I invite you to face each other and join hands.

Bride and Groom face each other holding hands.

Blessing of the Rings

The designated person gives the rings to the Officiant. Or in a smaller/simpler ceremony without a Best Man or Ringbearer the Officiant will already have the rings.

Wedding Prayer

Officiant:

Officiant:

Announcement as Newlyweds

Bride and Groom turn to face the guests as the officiant presents the couple.

Officiant: May I present to you Mr. and Mrs. _____!

The Maid/Matron of Honor hands the bouquet to the Bride. The Bride and Groom walk down the aisle first, followed by their attendants.
