Presentation of the Bride (or Bride and Groom)

Officiant: Who presents this woman to be married to this man?

Or <u>Officiant:</u> Who presents these individuals to be married?

The parent(s) or designated person(s) responds: I do Or, in unison: We do.

If the Bride has not already handed her bouquet to her Maid/Matron of honor, she will do so now, and her father gives her hand to the groom, he usually kisses his daughter and shakes the Grooms hand then he takes his seat. This Presentation of the Bride is optional and can be adapted to the situation or can be left out completely.

Charge to Bride and Groom

Officiant:

I charge you both, as you stand in the presence of God, to remember that love and loyalty alone will avail as the foundations of a happy and enduring home. If the solemn vows which you are about to make be kept permanently, your life will be full of peace and joy, and the home which you are establishing will abide through every change.

Betrothal

Officiant:

Having freely and prayerfully chosen each other as partners for life, and in an expression of your total commitment to one another, I invite you to face each other and join hands.

Bride and Groom face each other holding hands.
